Course Number: 512-27D10

Course Length: 10 weeks 3 days / Offered 18 times annually

Prerequisites: Active Army and Reserve Component, including National Guard, enlisted personnel SGT and below. Request for waiver for SSG through MSG may be submitted to OTJAG, Regimental Sergeant Major, **ATTN: DAJA-SM for Reserve and National Guard Soldiers only.**

Soldiers seeking to attend this course and hold MOS 27D, and must meet the following requirements: Physical profile - PULHES must be 222121. ASVAB Aptitude area and minimum score: CL 105 (If ASVAB was taken before 1 Jul 04, please contact TJAGLCS for additional information). A minimum typing speed of 25 net words-per minute. To qualify, applicants must: Be A High School graduate. Be A US Citizen. Hold a SECRET clearance. Have no court-marital convictions or disciplinary actions under formal Article 15 proceedings. Formal Article 15 waivable by HQDA (AHRC-EPM-A,) with TJAG approval. Must have no record of civil conviction other than minor traffic offenses. Minor non-traffic offense civil conviction waivable by HQDA (AHRC-EPM-A), with OTJAG approval. Must have no record of time lost under Section 972, 10 USC, (see appendix 3, MCM). (Lost time waivable by Cdr, HRC-DAPC-EPM-A, with TJAG approval). No pattern of undesirable behavior as evidenced by civilian or military records. No record of conviction by special or general courts-martial or civilian courts of offenses listed in AR 27-10 (Military Justice), chapter 24 or otherwise required to register as a sexual offender under AR 27-10, chapter 24.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Paralegal Specialists assist commanders and attorneys in providing legal services to Soldiers and family members. Areas of assistance include Military Justice (both prosecution and defense), Operational Law, Administrative Law, Legal Assistance (wills, powers of attorney, contracts, landlord tenant problems, taxes, etc.), Claims (both for and against the government), and International Law. AIT provides Soldiers with an opportunity to acquire the critical skills and knowledge necessary to provide legal services. Students must satisfactorily complete (graduate) AIT before they will be granted MOS 27D.
