Who (Prerequisites): Successfully completed Advanced Individual Training (AIT), serve in an operational law position, and/or preparing for CTC rotation / deployment. The course prepares skill level 2 and 3 Soldiers to develop, master, and refine key skills that will enhance their NSL knowledge in the operational environment.

Where (Location/enrollment): To enroll in NSL-P, students will must complete the ATRRS Registration Form found on Training Resources, and Publications (TRP) at <https://tjaglcs.army.mil/studentervices> or on JAGU at <https://jagu.llc.army.mil>. Students will **not** be enrolled if the application form is not signed by their supervisor or training officer. Once the registration form is complete and signed, email it to SFC Joshua McConnell, joshua.w.mcconnell2.mil@army.mil and Cc Ms. Twana Harden, twana.y.harden.civ@army.mil. Applications must be turned in **at least seven (7) days prior to the start date**. Any requests received afterwards will be applied to the next class.

Why (Readiness): NSL-P provides Soldiers with knowledge and understanding of a full spectrum of National Security Law in an innovative distance learning environment focusing on legal concepts, analysis, and application. NSL-P covers the following topics: Law of Armed Conflict, Non-International Armed Conflict, Legal Basis for the Use of Force, Rules of Engagement, Peacekeeping, Noncombatant Evacuation Operations, Dislocated Civilians, Intelligence and Interrogation Operations, Cyber and Space Operation, Foreign Claims, Domestic Operation, Fiscal Law, Army Operations, and Targeting.
