What (Course Name): National Security Law Primer (NSL-P)

Who (Prerequisites): Successfully completed Advanced Individual Training (AIT). Serve in an operational law position and/or deploying. The course prepares skill level 2 and 3 paralegals to develop, master, and refine key skills that will enhance their ability to assist Judge Advocates and command teams in the operational environment.

Where (Location/enrollment): To self-enroll in NSL-P, students use the ATRRS website via <https://atrrs.army.mil> and click COURSE CATALOG, then type in the COURSE NUMBER box "5F-F62" (without the quotation marks), and click SEARCH THE ATRRS COURSE CATALOG. A new page will load, click the on course number hyperlink and a new page will load with available class dates. Click on the word REGISTER in the far left column next to the class you like to register. Students are required to login using CAC. Once logged in, students must update their unit information and the rest is self-explanatory. If students experience any issues with enrollment, they should submit a help desk ticket through JAGU. To access the helpdesk and the course, log directly into JAGU (Firefox or Chrome browsers) at <https://jagu.army.mil> (turn off compatibility view to load in explorer).

Why (Readiness): NSL-P provides paralegal Noncommissioned Officers with knowledge and understanding of a full spectrum of National Security Law in an innovative distance learning environment focusing on legal concepts, analysis, and application. NSL-P covers the following topics: law of armed conflict, non-international armed conflict, legal basis for the use of force, rules of engagement, peacekeeping, noncombatant evacuation operations, dislocated civilians, intelligence and interrogation operations, cyber and space operation, foreign claims, domestic operation, fiscal law, Army operations, and targeting.
