

- Integrate COMPO II & III into all training efforts
- Annual FORSCOM Chaplain Priorities and Training Guidance (29 SEP 23)
 - Integrates FORSCOM Priorities / Operational Approach and Chief of Chaplains' Training Guidance / Priorities
- Battle Focused Training MOI (18 OCT 23)
 - Augments FORSCOM Chaplain Training Guidance
 - Focuses on common RS tasks which are nested in MET and the commander's intent
 - Informs training plan down to BDE level
- RS Training Multi-Compo Alignment and Partnerships
- CHC Manning and Talent Management
 - FORSCOM Chaplain Section manages ~ 500 Chaplains (1/3 of Active Duty Chaplain Corps) / Advocates for 56M assignments with HRC
 - Piloting Chaplain Leadership Assessment Tool (C-LAT)





...And we added Africa and NATO LANDCOM!


