Brigadier General Alison Martin began her career in 1992 as an Air Defense Artillery Officer and served in Saudi Arabia, the Republic of Korea, and Fort Bliss, Texas. After completing the Branch Detail program, she transferred to the Transportation Corps, serving as a Commander and Assistant S3 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

After completing law school, Brigadier General was assigned to Fort Bragg in XVIII Airborne Corps and the U.S. Army Special Operations Command as a trial counsel and Chief of Justice. Her next assignment was as the Chief of Justice and Chief of Administrative Law at I Corps and Fort Lewis. In 2006, she moved to the Office of The Judge Advocate General for the JAG Corps, working as the Chief of Operations for the Criminal Law Division. In 2010, she returned to Fort Bragg where she served as the Staff Judge Advocate for U.S. Army Special Forces Command (Airborne). She next served as an Associate Judge on the Army Court of Criminal Appeals before moving to the 1st Cavalry Division, where she served as the Staff Judge Advocate in Afghanistan and Fort Hood, Texas. After a tour in the Pentagon, Colonel Martin served as the Staff Judge Advocate for III Corps and Fort Hood, with deployments to Iraq and Kuwait in support of Operation Inherent Resolve. Most recently, she served as the Executive Officer for The Judge Advocate General.

Brigadier General Martin is admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court, the U.S. Army Court of Criminal Appeals, and the Supreme Court of the State of Minnesota. She is a graduate of the National War College (M.S. 2016), the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, and the Judge Advocate Officer Graduate Course (LL.M. 2004).

Her civilian education includes The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Law (J.D. 2000 – with Honors) and The Pennsylvania State University (B.S. 1992 - with Highest Distinction and with Honors).

Brigadier General Martin's awards include: the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star Medal, and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal. She is also authorized to wear the Army Staff Identification Badge, the Parachutist Badge, and the German Parachutist Badge.

She is married to Joe Martin, an Army Special Forces Colonel who retired after 26 years of service. They have two children.
