

Mr. Maurice Lescault Senior Civilian The Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School U.S. Army

Mr. Maurice Lescault began his longstanding service to the federal government in 1984 as a U.S. Army Engineer officer with the 20th Engineer Brigade, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. After completing law school in 1992, Mr. Lescault was assigned to DISCOM, 2d Infantry Division, ROK as a trial counsel with the Judge Advocate General's Corps. His next assignment was as trial counsel, USASOC, Fort Bragg, and then Command Judge Advocate, 4th PSYOP Group, Fort Bragg. From 1996-1999 he served as Associate Professor, Administrative & Civil Law Department, The Judge Advocate General's School, U.S. Army (TJAGSA). In 1999 he moved to the Office of the Army General Counsel (Ethics & Fiscal Law), Washington, DC. After a tour as Deputy Staff Judge Advocate, Fort Gordon, Georgia, he returned to TJAGSA to serve as Chair, Administrative & Civil Law Department, from which he retired from the U.S. Army after 21 years of active duty.

In 2005, Mr. Lescault became the first civilian Associate Dean of TJAGSA.

Mr. Lescault is admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court, the U.S. Army Court of Criminal Appeals, and the Supreme Court of the State of Rhode Island. He is a graduate of the United States Military Academy (B.S. 1984), the University of Connecticut (J.D. 1991 – with Highest Honors), the Judge Advocate Officer Graduate Course (LL.M. 1996 – Commandant's List), and the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College (2001). He also holds a Master's degree in History from Norwich University (2021).
